

The regular meeting of the Council was held on July 10th. Council members shared their prayer concerns for individual's medical needs; families separated at the border; for the recovery of the Thailand Soccer team trapped in a flooded cave; for connection, guidance and great experiences for both Vacation Bible School and Crossroads Connection meal.

Devotions: Pastor led devotions from Proverbs 11:24 and Hebrews 13:2. The first reminds us that God loves a cheerful giver, not just in the monetary sense but also through the giving of the time and talents God has given each of us. The second speaks how we are all God's children and how we are invited to accept and welcome one another, not just at home or church but in our daily life.

Visions for Ministry: Council continued the discussion in Chapter 3 and the connection it reveals to be more missional in both thinking and action. Being faithful to "what was" (Western Church) or "what is" (Eastern Church). The Living God continuously inviting all of us into a relationship with God. Council Members are asked to read Chapter 4 in "We Are Here Now" by Patrick Keifert before the next meeting.

Committee Reports: Reports were received from the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer. Please continue to give generously.

Christian Education: Vicki made the statement that all who are willing to help out with Vacation Bible School on Saturday, July 21st would be greatly appreciated. The VBS theme this summer is "Lego: Building on Jesus – Faith."

Evangelism/Outreach: We are now serving 45 to 50 individuals through the Loaves and Fishes Pantry; it is an awesome thing to witness this service growing through word of mouth.

OTOC House meeting will take place here later in August at Grace and we plan to include conversations with St. Luke's and Prince of Peace.

Finance: The Congregation Computer and Internet Use Policy and the Operational Ethics Policy was approved and passed by the Council.

The Endowment Board met on Sunday, July 1st and the Council ratified the Disney Endowment distributions.

Property: MUD did not receive a copy of both reports regarding the backflow preventers. They are contacting the inspection company to receive their report copy.

Service/Social Ministry: Everything is in place for the Crossroads Ministry meal on Sunday, August 5th, Colleen has agreed to play for the service and Mary, Arlone and Amanda will be in charge as Vicki will be out of town that weekend.

Support/Stewardship: None. Worship: None. Unfinished Business: None.

New Business: The Council has been encouraged to think of a project for "God's Work – Our Hands" which will be held this year on Sunday, September 9th.

Announcements: There will be a Council Gathering from the six cluster churches on Wednesday, August 22nd to participate in cross conversations and enjoy three different meal courses at three different locations. Augustana will provide the appetizer at 6:00 p.m. Bethel will serve the meal at 7:00 p.m. and St. Luke's will finish with desert at 8:00 p.m., please reserve the evening.

The annual baseball event (a Storm Chaser's game!) with St. Luke's will be August 4th.

River Boat ride will be on Sunday, September 23rd. An invitation will be extended to Prince of Peace and the Sudanese ministries. A Potluck lunch will be served at Grace following the boat ride.

I have been struck by the faithful efforts of many spiritual leaders who seek to rebuild community in times of chaos and a fracturing of community. In May, a group of twenty-three Christian leaders and elders of various denominations presented “Reclaiming Jesus: A Confession of Faith in a Time of Crisis.” [http://](http://www.reclaimingjesus.org/)

Here is a portion of their confession: “We are living through perilous and polarizing times as a nation, with a dangerous crisis of moral and political leadership at the highest levels of our government and in our churches. We believe the soul of the nation and the integrity of faith are now at stake.

“[As Christians,] it is time to be followers of Jesus before anything else—nationality, political party, race, ethnicity, gender, geography—our identity in Christ precedes every other identity. . . . “By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another” (John 13:35).”

Parker Palmer broadens this shared responsibility to those of other faiths:

“All three traditions [Christianity, Judaism, and Islam] are misunderstood because some of their alleged adherents engage in hateful and violent behavior that distorts and defies the values they claim to represent. At their core, Christianity, Islam, Judaism, and all of the major world religions are committed to compassion and hospitality. . . . In this fact lies the hope that we might reclaim their power to help reweave our tattered civic fabric.”

I hope that I can faithfully partner with these and many others as we seek to exemplify the very heart of Jesus. Building community is paramount to our efforts to be Christ-like. In building community, I hope to share the love God has for me with all.



Items that clients cannot purchase with their food stamps are always appreciated: Dish Soap, Kleenex, Bar Soap, Deodorant, Toothbrush and toothpaste, Shaving Cream, Razors, Mouthwash (without alcohol), Feminine hygiene products, Hair products (combs, brushes, picks), Bathroom tissue, Shampoo, Dry Laundry Soap, Can Openers, Diaper wipers, and Diapers, especially sizes 4, 5, 6 and pull-ups.

Maintain Your Vehicle to Save Money and Energy

Keeping your car maintained properly does more than prolong its life: it'll save you money at the pump too. And you'll reduce smog and the emissions that contribute to global warming. Follow these tips to keep getting the maximum fuel efficiency from your car.

Change your air filter. Cleaning your air filter regularly can improve your gas mileage significantly.

Avoid speeding. Speeding, rapid acceleration, and hard braking are not only unsafe; they lower your gas mileage. Every 5 mph you drive over 50 mph is like paying an additional \$0.24 per gallon for gas.

Use cruise control. Using your cruise control will keep you driving at a more consistent speed and can generally improve fuel efficiency.

Don't idle. Idling wastes fuel. It's more efficient to turn the car off and restart when you are ready to go. Hitting the drive-through? Consider parking and picking up food inside. The US Department of Energy has some resources to encourage cities to reduce idling.


Lighten up. Driving around with heavy objects in your trunk? Leave them at home and save some fuel.

Inflate tires properly. Car tires that are under inflated will lead to poor gas mileage. You can often find the correct pressure for your car printed on the edge of the driver's side door.

Mileage still too low? A tune-up could make a considerable improvement in your miles per gallon.
