The regular meeting of the Council was held on May 11. The Council members shared their prayer concerns: We pray for Sandy Fitzgerald, who is battling brain cancer; we pray for Mickey Andersen, who is struggling with health concerns; we pray for Amy Johnson as she struggles with an infection along with brain cancer; we pray for Kent Cattlett as he continues his treatments for lung cancer; we pray for Kevin Courtney, as he is receiving treatments for colon cancer; we pray for Barbara Nelson, as she recovers from her stroke; we pray for Jerry Goodrich, as he continues to heal from his stroke with mounting financial concerns because of his illness; we pray for the family of Chris Nielsen, as mourn her death; we pray for our Grace shut-ins; we pray for Gwen Grady as she has recently been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer; we pray for Dede Wirt, who has cancer tumors of the lung; we pray for the family of Rose Anne Rexroat, who passed away from cancer; we pray for Ole Olson, as he struggles with Parkinson's Disease; we pray for the people affected by the severe tornado's in Oklahoma; we pray for the "recovery" of the oil spill disaster as it has presented many hazardous problems; we pray for the people of Guatemala and surrounding Central American countries that have political instability and economic depression; and we pray for the new elected leaders of Britain as well as leaders of all countries.

<u>Service/Social Ministry:</u> Pastor Laaker and Pastor Webb from St. Luke's have completed an application for a "Lutheran Volunteer" position. This will be a timely process with hopes of filling the position by mid August.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: Pastor Laaker and David Hufford will be attending the Synod Assembly in Grand Island on June 4-5, along with two other individuals from the congregation.

New Business: None.

<u>Announcements:</u> Vicki Cox will bring treats and lead prayer for our June Council meeting. There will be a Prayer Service on Monday, May 17th at Grace.



I have shared with you in a variety of ways the ongoing discussion in which our leaders and I have been engaged. Our discussions over the past year have been centered on the way in which we welcome others in this shared ministry. One of the gaps that we have identified and struggle to solve is the lack of relationship with our Latino neighbors. We have prayed about the ways that God might lead us in new directions, new opportunities and new connections.

We asked questions of one another. We reflected on the questions and the provocative writing of Stephanie Spellers in Radical Welcome. What are the possibilities? How can we engage the community with the structure and staff we currently have? It became apparent that we would need to do something different if we wanted a different outcome. We would need to have someone that was capable of communication with our Latino neighbors beyond the formal greeting. How would this be possible? Where might we look?

You may recall that some time ago (more than a year) we were engaged in conversation with our sister congregational leaders at St. Luke and Cristo Rey. Those conversations stalled and so we wondered, as leaders, if anything might ever come of those efforts. God has surprised us with an offer of partnership in a specific ministry effort.

God's surprise was that St. Luke was also interested in connecting in a new way with its immediate community. Our exploration of possibilities led us to consider a Lutheran Volunteer placement. Neither one of us, Grace or St. Luke, felt we could cover the monthly stipend by ourselves but splitting the cost made the idea workable. So, in April, our leaders on the Council authorized me to sit down with Pr. Patti Webb at St. Luke and fill out the application for Lutheran Volunteer Corps.

Lutheran Service Corps, an affiliate of Lutheran Volunteer Corps, is a partner in a national volunteer service program. It is for people who want to work for social justice, live in an intentional community, engage simple and sustainable living, and explore spirituality. We were approached by Lutheran Service Corps inquiring if we would be interested in the placement of a volunteer for a year of service. (This is not the first time we have been asked.) There are some small monthly costs associated with a volunteer. Volunteers receive a stipend that covers their basic living expenses (food, rent, transportation, health insurance, and a small personal spending allowance). This translates into a monthly cost of approximately \$800, to be divided equally between the two congregations.

We have submitted our application for a volunteer to fill a position of "Community Outreach Associate." We have requested that the volunteer be bilingual with English/Spanish proficiency. The duties of this position will be: 1) Community Assessment and Relationship Building, 2) Work with existing education and service programs to connect Latino participants, 3) Seek to link the community and the congregation in becoming ministry partners.

We are hopeful that God has a person already chosen for this placement. We will be interviewing potential volunteers in June, if our application sparks the interest of one or more individuals. If we are blessed, a volunteer will be placed with this partnership in August. The first day of work for the new volunteer will be August 24. The placement is for one year.

I would ask that you join me and your elected leaders in praying that God will connect us to the right person for whom this ministry effort is a match. I invite your continued generous support of our shared ministry with your regular gifts. I am hopeful that God will work God's amazing grace on this ministry effort.

At Interfaith Health Service, we are pleased to share that we were awarded a small grant from the Omaha Community Foundation this month! Thanks to a generous donation of 12 designer wedding dresses from Jane, a Vice President at Wells Fargo bank, Interfaith's Latinas in Action participants were able re-bead and repair the dresses and have them available for women in the South Omaha community seeking affordable wedding dresses. Thus far, four of our re-worked dresses have been sold or donated to local women.

The Omaha Community Foundation grant will help us take this project to the next level. In the months ahead, we will be soliciting donations of clean, gently used wedding and bridesmaid or prom dresses (that can be used for quincenera celebrations). Our participants, together with congregation members from St. Francis Church, one of our many partners, will alter the dresses or rework them to recycle in the community. This will be a great opportunity for our group members to learn more about running a micro-business and will also fill a need within the community. I hope to post a few photos to our website as the project expands. (Who am I kidding, I am not technically advanced, I am hoping Pastor Laaker will post the photos!)

Thanks for your prayers and support during our grant writing season. I am grateful that we are blessed to begin a new venture with our participants.




