

I come to church to be surrounded with a community that sees itself as the church. I then am the church as I live out my life within the community. This means that I hope that people see the face of Christ in me, my actions, and my interactions. It means that I have to be bold enough to be ready to answer, “Why are you doing this?” It means that I must be willing to extend God's care in all moments of my life not just within the walls of church.

How do you see yourself in this picture? As we enter the Easter season, Christ arises to bring new life to each one of us. How will you live out this new life?




