A brief meeting of the Council was held on November 10th. The Council members shared their prayer concerns: We pray for the healing of those close to us; for Janet's sister, Jackie Costello who has had outpatient back surgery, for Eva's grandson, Donavan with his recent bought of illness, and for Ralph's cousin, Steve Anstey and his recent discovery of a spot on his lung. We rejoice that we will be celebrating Gertrude Hufford's 105th birthday! Devotions were shared throughout the morning.

<u>Visions for Ministry</u>: While the Council continues reading "Can Our Church Live?" by Alice Mann, we did not discuss it at this meeting. We heard reports from those that attended the New Vision Workshops, and learned many things. We recognize the need for mission, we continue under guidance and work toward the end goal. Ideas about getting congregations involved were mentioned. What is the biggest need <u>outside</u> of our walls? Maybe the focus should be less about bringing folks inside, but more about reaching out. We will intend to discuss Chapter four of our book at our next meeting.

Boxes of foods were sent to the pantry, along with \$183 in monetary support. Thank you to all that participated in either / both of these events!

<u>Support/Stewardship:</u> Fall Mission Gathering – Enjoyable evening, met with many folks that were new to us. Heard many mission stories, many of them similar to our own. Good reminder that what we do at Grace is quite impactful!

<u>Worship:</u> St Luke's will host the Thanksgiving Eve Service, at 7 p.m., for approximately 8 congregations.

Our fall stewardship emphasis theme has been "Fulfilling God's Purpose." Over the last four weeks we have explored four aspects of this theme.; 1. Building Relationships, 2. Witnessing for Jesus, 3. Living as a Servant, and 4. Giving Joyfully and Generously. I have found the exploration of these aspects to be encouraging and hopeful.

The adult group that has met on Sunday morning has also explored these aspects of the theme. We have shared personal stories and thoughtful responses to questions like: 1. What is the difference between knowing about Jesus and having a relationship with him? 2. Why can't you rely solely on your lifestyle to witness? 3. How can serving bless the server? and 4. How has God demonstrated God's love for you?

This time has been especially enriching to me since it has come before we celebrate Thanksgiving. It has given me pause to think about all the ways the people of God at Grace Lutheran exemplify being children of God.

Sometimes it is easy to think Grace is a small congregation and therefore is limited in its mission outreach. I really believe this is a false thought. When I think about the manner in which the people of God share their regular giving so that we can provide leadership and outreach within the Omaha community, I am amazed and thankful.

I am thankful for the kind of response the people of God have shown for sponsoring a weekly emphasis on childhood hunger by gifting to the Backpack program of the Heartland Food Bank. I see the results of regular gifts to the Lutheran Pantry. I witness the monthly contribution sent through the Nebraska Synod for the ELCA World Hunger program.

I have served on the Bishop's staff and know that not every congregation, large or small does these kinds of things on a regular basis. The witness of these efforts is a big thing as followers of Jesus.

You have heard me say in worship and in print that I believe Grace Lutheran is meant to be a place for all peoples. You will see in the Council Notes that our leadership has made a decision to share our physical space with another small worshipping community, Prince of Peace Pentecostal Church, a Latino congregation. This decision, I believe, is made through the leading of the Spirit.

As we prepare during Advent for the celebration of the coming of our Savior, may we give thanks for God's amazing grace and for the marvelous ways we are invited to be living examples of this grace in and through our lives. May we rejoice in the privilege to share our resources with others. May we experience the joy and wonder of Christ alive in each of us.

The closing prayer of The Daily Texts for Tuesday, November 26, read like this: Creator God, you are the giver of all life and possessions. You freely give to us and yet we fear we lack so much. We desire more and more. Break our attitude of greed. Give us your generous Spirit so that we can know your life-giving abundance. Amen.




 The ten lords a-leaping were the ten commandments.
