



On Sunday, June 22, as I began my morning message, I reflected on the Leadership Conference I attended in Chicago at the Lutheran School of Theology. The title of the conference was "Fear Not: Risks, Ministry, and the Gospel." I have found myself reflecting on the days that led up to my beginning seminary training at Christ

Seminary – Seminex. These were days of great concern for me.

The church body that had nurtured and shaped my desire to become a pastor was embroiled in controversy. Charges and counter charges were being tossed back and forth like a game of hand grenades. One was never sure what kind of explosion would rock the scene next.

It was important for me to reflect on the stories told at the conference about the risks students and faculty took in standing against the fear of condemnation and dismissal all for the sake of the freedom offered to us through the gospel of Jesus Christ.

I think about the risks the call committee took at Grace some thirty years ago. Yes, we had an interview and we shared questions and answers. We each took a risk in agreeing to begin this relationship as pastor and people.

I think about the risks the members of the congregation took in decisions to stay in part of the city. A fire, an interstate system and a changing community were all risks that had an effect on the ministry offered. I do marvel that the decision to stay seems to be grounded in the desire to live out the gospel.

I think about the risk that the congregation took in allowing me to take a sabbatical. I could have used the time to search out some other place that was more exciting or appealing. However, I used the time to explore new avenues of ministry in diverse communities for right here.

I am grateful that ministry of love and care is a special mark of Grace. It is also a special mark of the gospel and that seems to be evident in work of each of your lives.

Thank you for taking the risks of calling me as your pastor, allowing me to bring back ideas from other places and being willing to try other means of ministry in this community. Thank you for nurturing me and my family with your love and care.

I wonder what God has in store for us as we attempt to fear not living faithfully in ministry that proclaims the wonderful freedom of love in Christ Jesus.


