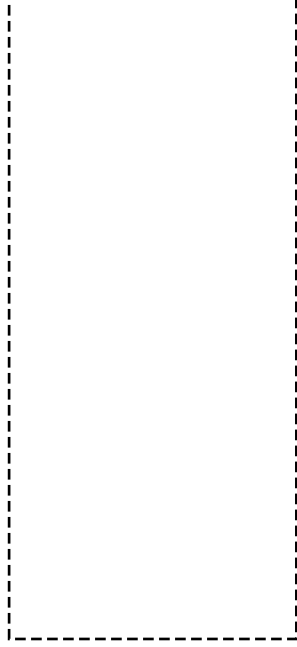

The regular meeting of the Council was held on March 20th. Council members shared their prayer concerns for individual’s medical needs; individuals who have lost loved ones, unrest around the world, the violence that seems too commonplace and for favorable spring weather.

Devotions: Pastor led devotions from Isaiah 52:9 and Ephesians 2:8. The first speaks about the comforts of God through the good news and the second speaks about God’s unconditional love for us all.

Visions for Ministry: Council discussed the Introduction and felt that the book will look into the many changes in community and churches. Some of the language can be challenging and that dictionaries are useful. Council are asked to read Chapter 1 in “We Are Here Now” by Patrick Keifert.

Committee Reports: Reports were received from the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer. Please continue to give generously.

Christian Education: Vicki will talk with Amanda regarding this summer’s VBS program.

Evangelism/Outreach: Council received a thank you letter from St. Luke’s for the support in their reading program partnership with Spring Lake Elementary School.

OTOC will hold their 9th annual Spring Fundraiser on March 24th at Kaneko, 1111 Jones Street. In support of the fundraiser, Grace will provide a basket for the silent auction.

Pastor has had one interview with an applicant, Peder Johnson, for the 2018-2019 Lutheran Volunteer Corps position. He has not learned if Peder was assigned to Grace.

AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities) Grace has been encouraged to become a Welcoming Congregation, to be a positive presence for immigrating families going through the court systems. After a brief discussion the Council agreed to become a Welcoming Congregation.

Finance: Invitation to the Tri-Faith Initiative Dinner in Abraham’s Tent will be held on Sunday, April 22nd from 6:00 to 9:00 pm. at the CenturyLink. An evening of laughter, fellowship and inspiration.

ELCA Reports both Form A and Form C (which report numbers of the congregation) have been filed for the year.

Property: The kitchen stove has been repaired and the clicking noise has stopped.

A boiler piece has been replaced by Leo’s Heating. Insurance and state inspections are currently taking place and a new tag has been placed on the boiler.

Table Grace has asked for permission to park their new Food Trailer in our parking lot 2 to 3 times a week, with the knowledge that there are weekly events that happen and should an unplanned event happen they would have an additional site to park the new food trailer.

Service/Social Ministry: None. Support/Stewardship: None.

Worship: Council remains in agreement to hold the Easter Sunrise Service at 6:30 a.m.

Unfinished Business: Nebraska Synod has invited congregations to bring a block of wood to the assembly in Kearney in support of a “Foundation of A Cross” project.

Announcements: Brenda brought attention to Creighton’s event [Jewish – Palestinians equality with guest speaker Miko Peled] at St. John’s Church on Tuesday, April 10th would conflict with our next council meeting and proposed the meeting be pushed back a week to April 17th to give council members the choice to attend this event. Our church year has reached its climax with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Now we travel the path to the cross with him during Holy Week. Our celebration becomes complete when we arrive at the empty tomb on Easter morning. This year it is a bit of paradox with Easter falling on April 1, April fool's day. Oh, the foolishness of God's work among us.

Earlier this month, I was reading a daily devotional that uses selections from Henri Nouwen's writings. I was particularly struck by the one titled "Jesus Is God-Who-Suffers-with-Us." This is a portion of his work titled: Letters to Marc About Jesus.

He writes, "God sent Jesus to make free persons of us. He has chosen compassion as the way to freedom. That is a great deal more radical than you might at first imagine. It means that God wanted to liberate us, not by removing suffering from us, but by sharing it with us. Jesus is God-who-suffers-with-us. Over time, the word *sympathizing* has become a somewhat feeble way of expressing the reality of "suffering with" someone. Nowadays, when someone says: "I have sympathy for you," it has a rather distant ring about it. The feeling, at least for me, is of someone looking down from above. The word's original meaning of "suffering together with someone" has been partly lost. That's why I've opted for the word *compassion*. It's warmer, more intimate, and closer. It's taking part in the suffering of the other, being totally a fellow human being in suffering. . . .

"Jesus is the revelation of God's unending, unconditional love for us human beings. Everything that Jesus has done, said, and undergone is meant to show us that the love we most long for is given to us by God, not because we deserved it, but because God is a God of love."

As we celebrate Easter's message of God's love alive, may we recognize the ways that God grants to us have compassion with and for others. May our lives become living examples of God's compassion lived together with one another.

Birds on the Wing

Birds may be the most welcome harbingers of spring. Colorful to see, a delight to hear, birds lend grace and beauty to our surroundings and provide natural insect control. To make your residence or neighborhood an inviting sanctuary for birds, create places for them to nest, feed, drink, and wash. Here's some advice on birdhouses, feeders, and birdbaths:

Birdhouses. If suitable natural nesting habitats such as old trees are in short supply, build or buy a birdhouse and install it out of reach of cats, squirrels, and other predators.

Feeders. Commercial bird feeders are available in most hardware stores, but you can also make feeders out of plastic bottles or milk cartons that can be hung from safe places such as a clothesline. If you prefer to grow bird food, consider planting native wildflowers, shrubs, and sunflowers.



Cultivated flowers also are especially attractive to some birds, particularly goldfinches, house finches, juncos, white-throated sparrows, and hummingbirds.

Bird Baths. Birds are most comfortable with a rough-surfaced source of water about 2 feet wide, no more than 2 inches deep. A shallow dish or gently-sloping bowl placed right on the ground will do, as will a plastic or terra cotta plant dish or inverted metal trash lid. Put the bath out in the open, not close to shrubs or places where cats can hide. A thorny bush or protective brush pile may make the birds feel more secure.

Curriculum is shared from Spark House. Spark House has been supplying the little devotional booklets that have been available on the back table in the sanctuary.

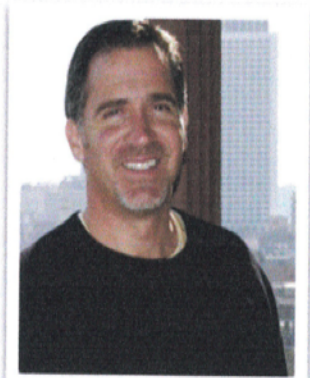
