The Council has begun reading "Baptized for This Moment; Rediscovering Grace All Around Us" by Stephen Paul Bouman. In the Foreword, Stacy Martin says, "It's not that we really believe that God resides in church buildings. We know better. But our actions often imply that the world has no place in church. The FROM OUR world is too messy and an hour on Sunday doesn't leave us **PASTOR** enough time to clean things up. This might not be a problem were

it not for the theological conundrum of Christ's incarnation. As Bishop Bouman outlines . . ., we've spent so much time trying to figure out how to get the church out into the world, we've forgotten to invite the world into our churches." These words have been bouncing around in my thoughts since I first read the Foreword.

How do we invite the world into our churches? The world is often a very scary place. In the last week, we have watched and listened to the flooding that has devastated much of eastern Nebraska. We have watched and listened to the terrorist who murdered 49 persons of the Muslim faith in New Zealand. Do we dare these horrific things into our churches? Are we not supposed to find peace within our churches? These things don't bring peace, they only bring sadness and sorrow, helplessness and futility. Our hearts break and we lament these and many other messy things of our world.

Bishop Bouman was serving as Bishop of New York Synod at the time of the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center. He describes the experience of 9/11 and its aftermath. We often want to move on guickly after very difficult times. He suggests that "the first response of the Church in the face of any of the tragedies we now find afflicting us (is): Show up. Listen. Tell stories. Pray."

I wonder how we might be willing to show up in the most recent tragedies. I wonder how we might listen to those who have experienced these tragedies directly. I wonder if we can encourage the telling of the stories that arise out of the tragedy. I wonder if we can purposefully pray.

I am convinced that hope arises out these efforts. I am convinced that in showing up Christ is present to comfort and attend to the brokenness. I am convinced that the Spirit moves between us as we listen intently to the stories not seeking to simply move on but to pause and hold the sorrow tenderly. I am convinced that prayer in all of its forms is a vital healing measure for the world and the church.

How do you see hope arising out of tragedy? How might we see genuine love get expressed?






