Worship Plan Update

Our efforts to provide in-person worship outside during the month of September were met with reasonably good weather. The early morning rain last Sunday the 27th, forced us inside. Fewer people came out due to the rain, so we were able to maintain appropriate social distance.

You will note in the council notes that our leaders have decided that it is in our best interest to continue meeting outside during the month of October, weather permitting. We are awaiting the arrival of small electrostatic fogging device that enable us to easily disinfect the sanctuary areas before use. This way, if it is necessary, we can move indoors with added safety.

We will continue to follow CDC guidelines which include appropriate social distancing and wearing a face mask.

- * If you have any potential symptoms, please refrain from attending. We want everyone to be safe.

For those who continue to wait safely at home, we will be recording the service. It will be uploaded to YouTube after the service. So, it will not be available the first thing in the morning but will be posted as soon as possible after the service.



2020 Council Members

The regular meeting of the council was held on September 8th. Council members shared their prayer concerns for those dealing with death, surgery, health diagnosis, all of the people affected by COVID-19, teachers & students, our upcoming elections that they be protected and made available to all citizens who want to exercise their right to vote, victims of violence, and Officer Herrera's family.

<u>Devotions</u>: Devotions were led by Pastor Laaker, reading the selected verses in the "*Daily Texts*" from Ezekiel 20:44 and Luke 6:35. The first tells us that God deals with us because of God's love not because of our evil ways. The second is a reminder that God cares for everyone, even the wicked, and so should we.

<u>Visions for Ministry</u>: We reviewed chapter 3 and 4 in our book Uproar. The author explains how the brain responds to anxiety and the effects that that response can have on our decisions and reactions. He also talks about the importance of gaining control over our reactions and the reactivity of others so that we can begin to take constructive action based on principle and thoughtfulness.
